2.1 Company

Silent Sounds Communications is a private organisation based in High Wycombe. We specialise in many areas of Spoken, Deaf and Translation Services.

We are passionate about promoting deaf awareness and continually strive to ensure that deaf/hearing impaired people have equal access to the services that they require. We work within a wide variety of areas. There are approximately 9 million deaf people in the UK all using different forms of communication. Therefore, we have concentrated on providing a wide range of deaf communication services, which includes British Sign Language, Deaf Relay, Sign Supported English (SSE), Lipspeaking and Notetaking. We are also able to provide Irish, American & Farsi Sign Language and Deafblind Manual interpreting when required.

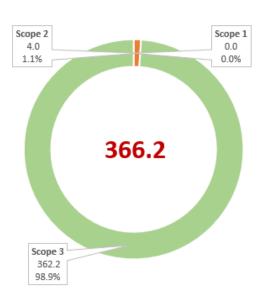
3 Carbon Emissions Overview

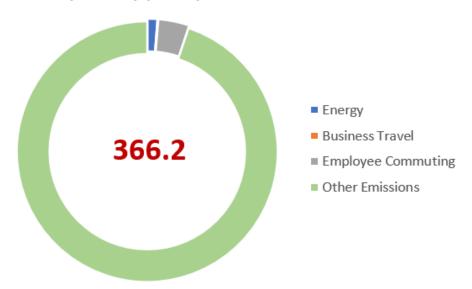

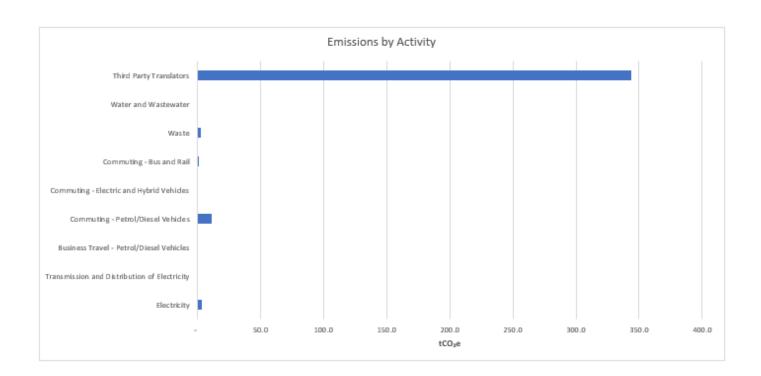

As our freelance interpreters are the largest source of carbon emissions, Silent Sounds is proactively promoting its robust Video Interpreting (VI) platform to reduce carbon emissions by reducing travel as well as potential logistical issues. The take up is set to rise as budgets decrease across all sectors and the VI platform will enable interpreters to take on more assignments within one working day.

In September 2025 we moved Unit 9 on to Octopus energy supplying renewable electricity which will have a positive impact on the next report. Since Unit 10 remains in contract with EON until March 2027, we have moved to the renewable tariff and in 2027 we will merge both units with Octopus.

6 Intensity Metric Analysis

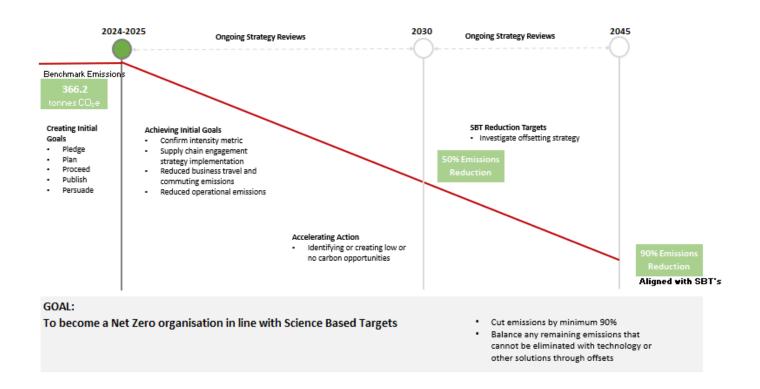
Intensity metrics help normalise emissions data, taking into account variations in production levels or activity volumes. This allows for a more accurate assessment of emission trends over time, regardless of changes in business operations. The initial intensity metrics for the company are below and will be used for comparative purposes in following years.

The chosen intensity metrics shows a carbon emissions value of **13.1 tCO₂e** per employee and **0.1 tCO₂e** per £1,000 of turnover. The business headcount averaged 28 people during the benchmark period.

8 Carbon Reduction Actions

Silent Sounds aims to develop the following initiatives that will support the company's strategies to meet Science Based Targets:

Area of Focus	Initiative
Engagement of Team	To engage the entire team throughout the organisation in the Net Zero transition plan and to encourage staff to support lower carbon ideas, opportunities, and activities.
Business Travel Emissions	To introduce a sustainable travel policy encouraging use of public transport and lower carbon options when practical to do so. This will be implemented during 2026.
Carbon Emissions Dashboard	Silent Sounds has made the commitment to complete its carbon emissions dashboard on a regular basis. This is overseen by a member of the Senior Management Team and shared with the wider team on a quarterly basis. By partnering with Net Zero International, we gain access to their expertise and support in reporting our emissions and how to reduce them, including best practice and insights. We will also promote our activities on social media to encourage others to make lower carbon decisions.
Supply Chain Review	To carry out a full review of the supply chain, developing a full plan in 2025 – 2026, followed by the introduction of a sustainable supply chain policy in 2026.
Third Party Translator Costs	Review feasibility of reducing third party translator costs and employing direct staff.
Energy Tariffs	Switched to a renewable electricity tariff.
Data Collection	Developing internal systems and processes to capture key billing data for future carbon reduction reports.

10 Standard and Methodology Used

Silent Sounds categorises its Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Emissions as Scope 1, 2 or 3 as referred to in the WBCSD − WRI Greenhouse Gas Protocol (revised edition, dated March 2014). Emissions in Carbon Dioxide equivalent (CO₂e) for all scopes are calculated using the conversion factors listed in DESNZ Greenhouse Gas Conversion Factors for the relevant 12-month period over which the carbon emissions are calculated. Procured renewable electricity and gas is calculated in accordance with the WBCSD − WSI Scope 2 Guidance on procured renewable energy (2015).

11 Data Quality / Confidence

The data used to generate this report has been collected from various sources from both within the company and using assumptions gathered by Net Zero International. These emissions have been converted to CO₂e using GHG Protocol and DESNZ frameworks and conversion factors for the relevant period.

12 Declaration and Sign Off

This Carbon Reduction Plan has been completed in accordance with SECR, PPN 006 and associated guidance and reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans.

Emissions have been reported and recorded in accordance with the published reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans and the GHG Reporting Protocol corporate standard and uses the appropriate Government emission conversion factors for greenhouse gas company reporting.

Scope 1 and Scope 2 emissions have been reported in accordance with SECR requirements, and the required subset of Scope 3 emissions have been reported in accordance with the published reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans and the Corporate Value Chain (Scope 3) Standard.
